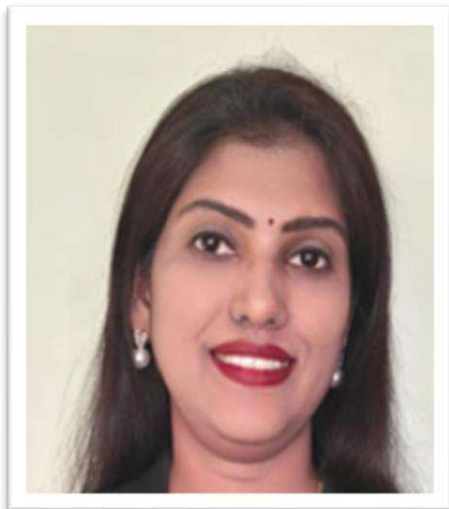
Dear Parents

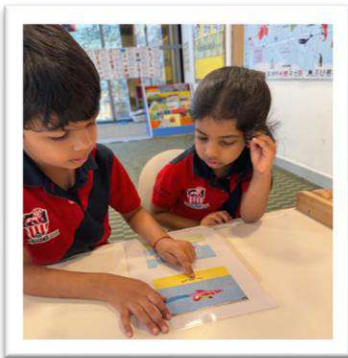
Re-Enrollment for 2026-27

Classroom Highlights



Kindergarten

Students have been working on mastering blending sounds to make CVC words and write them, some can even write simple sentences using the sight words and CVC words we have learnt so far. Reading books with your buddy is another hit in my classroom.

PRE-K 4B - Arctic Ocean

Children participated in a circle-time learning session about the **Arctic Ocean**. Using a visual chart, they explored where the Arctic Ocean is located near the North Pole, learned about the Inuit people and their clothing, and discovered Arctic animals such as polar bears, whales, and walrus. The session encouraged listening, observation, and discussion, helping students build early geography and world-awareness skills in an engaging and interactive way.

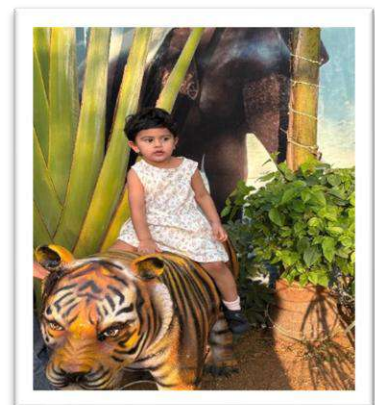


PT-PG - Book Day

PT/PG celebrated **Book Day** with a joyful storytelling session where parents narrated engaging stories about safari animals, Wild animals and 'dog and peep' sparking children's imagination and love for books. The children listened attentively, responded to the stories, building early language, and listening skills. This was followed by a creative bookmark activity where children blew through straws to spread colors, strengthening their fine motor skills and creativity. The day encouraged communication, concentration, and a growing appreciation for reading in a fun and interactive way.

PT/PG - FIELD TRIP

Blending real-life experiences with learning - Our little explorers went on a delightful field trip with their parents, discovering farm and pet animals up close. The children enjoyed exciting bike, train, and bus rides, making their journey full of fun and movement. Feeding the birds was a special highlight, sparking curiosity and nurturing a sense of care for nature. This enriching experience supported sensory exploration, early science learning, gross motor development, and meaningful parent-child bonding moments — a perfect blend of learning, laughter, and adventure!



PRE-K3 A - FIELD TRIP

Mrugavani National Park - The children had a wonderful time at Mrugavani National Park. They observed different types of plants and collected a few leaves for a class activity. They also enjoyed watching rabbits, peacocks, and deer. The children were curious and excited while feeding the deer, making the experience truly memorable.



NURSERY - B

Little Hands, Big Skills - As part of our ongoing theme “Clothes”, our nursery children had a fun and hands-on experience with washing and drying clothes. The little learners enjoyed scrubbing, rinsing, and hanging tiny pieces of fabric, practicing their fine motor skills, and learning about daily life routines. They also loved using cloth pegs and seeing their “laundry” dry on the line — a perfect way to build independence and responsibility while having fun. Learning through play has never looked so adorable!



Grade 2 has started a unit on drum technique in music class. The children first learned proper grip and stroke, and eventually, they became proficient on a tricky sticking pattern called the paradiddle. They worked in groups to improve their speed on the paradiddle, each child playing in a group that could keep a similar pace. This allowed the students to practice in their zone of proximal development, with a tempo that was slightly difficult for them, enabling them to improve their speed, without getting bored or overwhelmed. This activity is not only building drummers but wiring brains for focus, coordination, and building the same neural pathways that make sense of logic and mathematics.

International Mother Language Day – Assembly the Day unfolded as a joyful tribute to culture, identity, and the spirit of open-mindedness. The campus buzzed with excitement as students came prepared to showcase the richness of their native languages. With pride and confidence, they shared greetings, meaningful words, and the affectionate names used for “mother” and “father” in their homes. Each presentation was a heartfelt reminder that language is more than communication — it is a connection to heritage and belonging.

Students dressed as favorite characters, participated in storytelling sessions, and exchanged books in a vibrant book swap. This event reinforced literacy skills and community bonding through the joy of literature.

Grade 2 – Assembly – Importance of Family

A good morning turned into a beautiful celebration as our wonderful Grade 2 students presented a heart-warming assembly on the theme “Family – the people who love us, care for us, and make our lives happy.” The young learners confidently expressed how family is our strongest support system and the first place where we learn values that shape our character. Through meaningful presentations and thoughtful reflections, they highlighted the importance of kindness, respect, helpfulness, sharing, and responsibility in building strong family bonds.
